How to make a legacy gift to King's University College

<u>Unrestricted Gifts:</u>

Power to Vary Clause:

If, in the opinion of King's University College and King's University College Foundation, it is impossible, impractical or inadvisable to use this gift for the specified purpose(s), then the Board may in their discretion use the gift to the best advantage of King's University College, keeping in mind the original wishes of the donor.
